Holy Week

Once again, we are approaching the end of Lent and the opportunity to inhabit the story of the dramatic events of Holy Week. It was a time of darkness and cruelty ... human weakness and confusion ... great teaching and poise ... a beautiful meal ... mystery ... cruelty and death ...and ultimately resurrection, hope and glory. Each year as I work through the week it feels like there is a fresh perspective; something new God wants to teach us. I do encourage to participate in this journey if you can.

Do sign up for the Maundy Thursday Meal which includes the poignant stripping of the Altar. Do walk with the Cross which the Rector will be carrying in each village in the Benefice on Good Friday ... followed by the devotional service at 2pm. At the Easter Vigil we enter that mysterious time between the death and Resurrection before celebrating Easter Morning in Long Melford.



Electoral Roll

Joining the Electoral Roll indicates your commitment to our church community and acts informally as a 'membership list' for the church. Sculptures of Hope

Each week during Morning Prayer we say Isaiah 2:4-5 as a prayer for peace: "God ... shall mediate for many peoples. They will beat their swords into plough shares, and their spears into pruning hooks." I confess that sometimes our faith is tested praying this. However, this week I learnt about two examples where weapons have been turned into works of art. Firstly in Mozambique which, though in relative peace after its civil war, is awash with weapons. The church has been at the forefront of a "Transforming Guns into Hoes" initiative, which resulted in thousands of weapons being handed in and the 'Tree of Life' sculpture below. Closer to home this amazing knife angel, made of over 100,000 seized knives, has toured many UK cities and needs little explanation as we reflect on the tragedy of some many young lives lost to knife crime. May we continue to pray that the God of reconciliation will reach hardened hearts.

<u>Readings for the 6th April - </u>Lent 5

Collect (prayer for the day)

Most merciful God, who by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ delivered and saved the world: grant that by faith in him who suffered on the cross we may triumph in the power of his victory; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

First Reading Philippians 3:4-14

Though I myself have reasons for such confidence.

If someone else thinks they have reasons to put confidence in the flesh, I have more: ⁵ circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews; in regard to the law, a Pharisee; ⁶ as for zeal, persecuting the church; as for righteousness based on the law, faultless.

⁷But whatever were gains to me I now consider loss for the sake of Christ. ⁸What is more, I consider everything a loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord, for whose sake I have lost all things. I consider them garbage, that I may gain Christ 9 and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which is through faith in [a] Christ - the righteousness that comes from God on the basis of faith. ¹⁰ I want to know Christ – yes, to know the power of his resurrection and participation in his sufferings, becoming like him in his death, ¹¹ and so, somehow, attaining to the resurrection from the dead.

¹² Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already arrived at my goal, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. ¹³ Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: forgetting what is behind and straining towards what is ahead, ¹⁴I press on towards the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenwards in Christ Jesus.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John

Glory to you, O Lord

Thanks be to God

Six days before the Passover, Jesus came to Bethany, where Lazarus lived, whom Jesus had raised from the dead. ² Here a dinner was given in Jesus' honour. Martha served, while Lazarus was among those reclining at the table with him. ³ Then Mary took about half a litre of pure nard, an expensive perfume; she poured it on Jesus' feet and wiped his feet with her hair. And the house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. ⁴ But one of his disciples, Judas Iscariot, who was later to betray him, objected, ⁵ 'Why wasn't this perfume sold and the money given to the poor? It was worth a year's wages.' ⁶He did not say this because he cared about the poor but because he was a thief; as keeper of the money bag, he used to help himself to what was put into it.

⁷ 'Leave her alone,' Jesus replied. 'It was intended that she should save this perfume for the day of my burial. 8 You will always have the poor among you, but you will not always have me.'
